### **Overview of the General Plan Update**




### What is a General Plan?

- Long-term policy document to guide future actions
- Establishes the **City's direction** for the next 20 years
- Enables the community to come together to develop a **shared vision for the future**
- Updated every 15-20 years
- Preserves and enhances **community strengths**
- Addresses key topics of concern

"Vision about how a community will grow, reflecting community priorities and values while shaping the future."

### WHAT IS A GENERAL PLAN?


A General Plan is like a road map for the future of the City of Marina.





### General Plan Requirements


- **9 Required Elements** 
  - 1. Land Use
- 2. Circulation
- 3. Housing
- 4. Noise
- 5. Conservation
- 6. Safety
- 7. Open Space
- 8. Air Quality
- 9. Environmental Justice





### **Existing General Plan**


- Last comprehensively adopted in 2000; Amended in 2010
- Organized by 3 overarching topics, each with sub-topics
  - **Community Land Use** (open space, housing, commercial uses, etc.)
  - **Community Infrastructure** (transportation, water, stormwater, etc.)
  - Community Design and Development (subareas, environmental protection and conservation)
  - Implementation






### Why Update the General Plan?

- General Plan is out of date; significant new State requirements since 2000
- Hold a "community conversation" about the future
- Address critical topics
  - Type and location of future development
  - Housing affordability
  - Infrastructure and water supply constraints
  - Habitat and biological resources
  - Local jobs and economic development
  - Mobility and trail access
  - Changing demographics
- Incorporate recent planning efforts
- Make the document more usable







### **Engagement Goals**

- Target groups traditionally not involved in the process – youth, students, non-English speakers, etc.
- Empower the public to guide the overall direction of the General Plan
- Conduct culturally appropriate engagement activities and reach a diverse cross section of the community
- Track progress over time

### **Reaching All Residents**

- Project website
- Citywide postcard mailings
- Email contact database
- Social media outreach (Nextdoor and Facebook)
- Bilingual materials
- Encourage community groups and stakeholder to engage their constituents
- Distribute printed materials at key locations (e.g., public libraries, churches, and unemployment offices) to communicate with "hard to reach" populations







### **Community Stakeholders**

- Local business owners (City & County Chambers of Commerce)
- Local homeowner associations (HOAs)
- Students/youth organization (Monterey Peninsula Unified School District)
- Environmental organizations (i.e., Landwatch)
- Economic development (CSUMB, Municipal Airport, Joby)
- Community groups and clubs (Korean-American Assoc, Filipino-American Club, Center for Community Advocacy, Marina Foundation, Rotary Club, etc.)



# **General Plan Advisory Committee**



### What is a General Plan Advisory Committee (GPAC)?

- Council-created advisory body
- Provide high-level guidance on:
  - Vision and Guiding Principles
  - Land use
  - Key policy topics including transportation, parks and open space, housing, economic development, and other key policy topics
- Serve as "ambassadors" for the General Plan by promoting events, talking with residents, and assisting with engagement





### Proposed GPAC Membership

- Diversity of perspectives and interests
- All residents or business/property owners in Marina
- Up to 11 members
  - 5 members identified by City Council
  - Staff will recommend up to 5 others
  - Chair of Planning Commission will be 1 member
- Level of commitment and responsibility
  - Attend 8+ meetings
  - Review key materials
  - Assist with engagement



• Ask: City Council provide names of 3 potential GPAC members with 1 as primary potential appointee by February 8.



### **GPAC Decision-Making and Conduct**

- Brown Act meetings, with time-limited public comments & feedback
- Operate in spirit of consensus
- Structured to allow a free flow exchange of ideas
- Consultants or city staff lead meetings; no Chair or Vice Chair
- Straw polls/voting for general direction; differences of opinion will be brought to the PC and CC
- Ask: City Council review the By Laws and provide comments at the Feb 22 City Council Meeting
