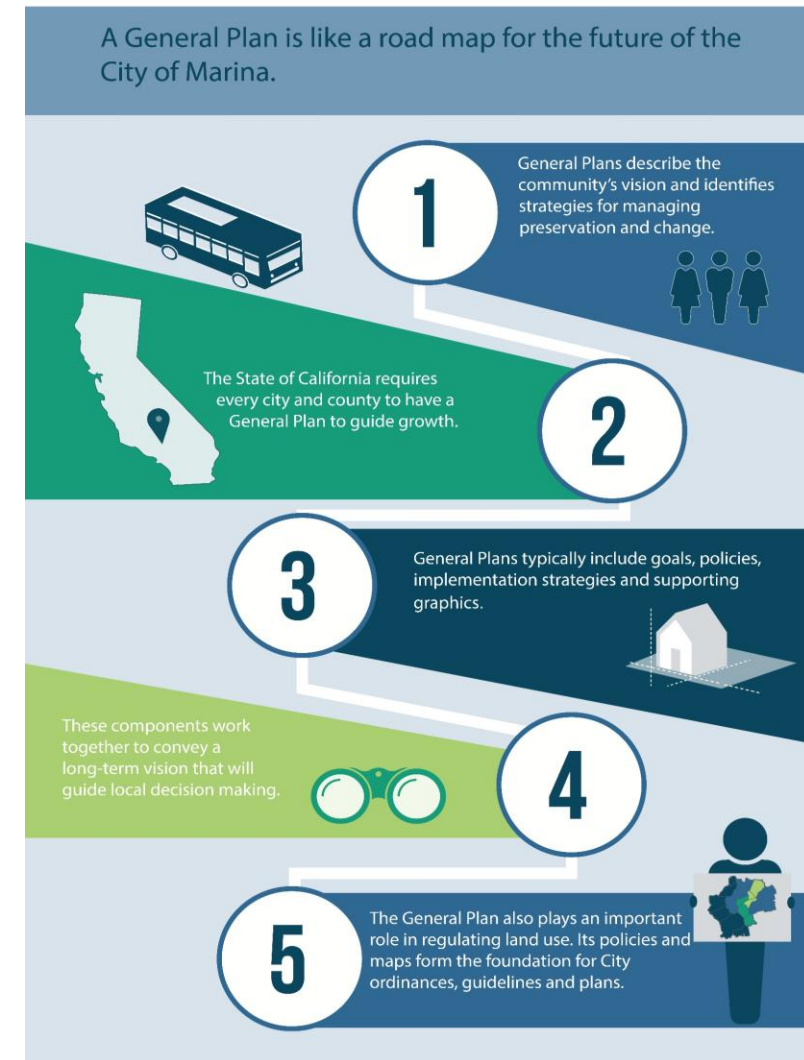


General Plan 2045 Update

What is a General Plan?

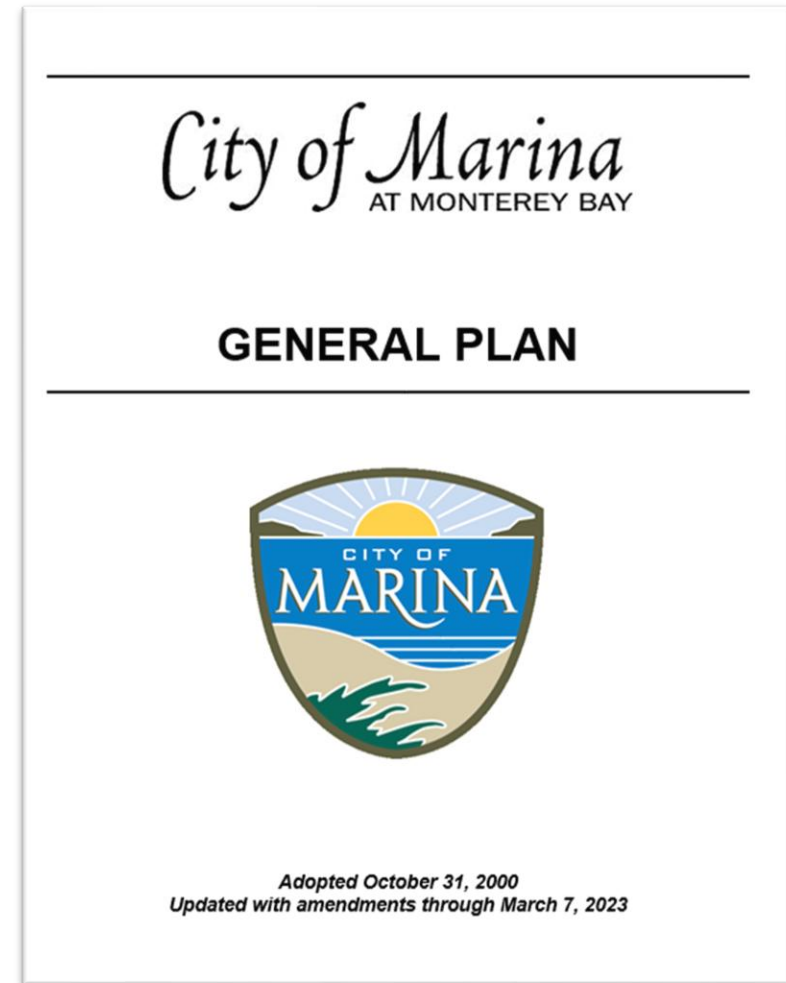
- Long-term policy document to **guide future actions**
- Establishes **City's direction** for the next 20 years
- Updated every 10 to 20 years
- Enables the community to come together to develop a **shared vision going forward**
- Preserves and enhances **community strengths**
- Addresses key **topics of concern**

“Vision for how a community will grow, reflecting community priorities and values while shaping the future.”



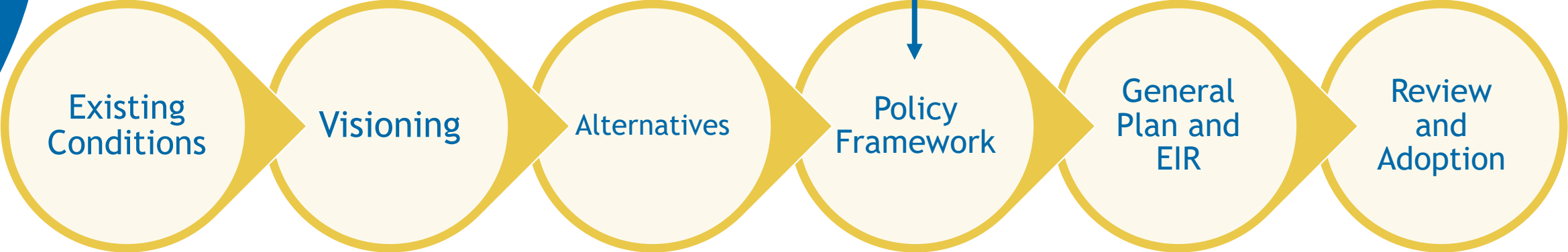
General Plan Policy Topics

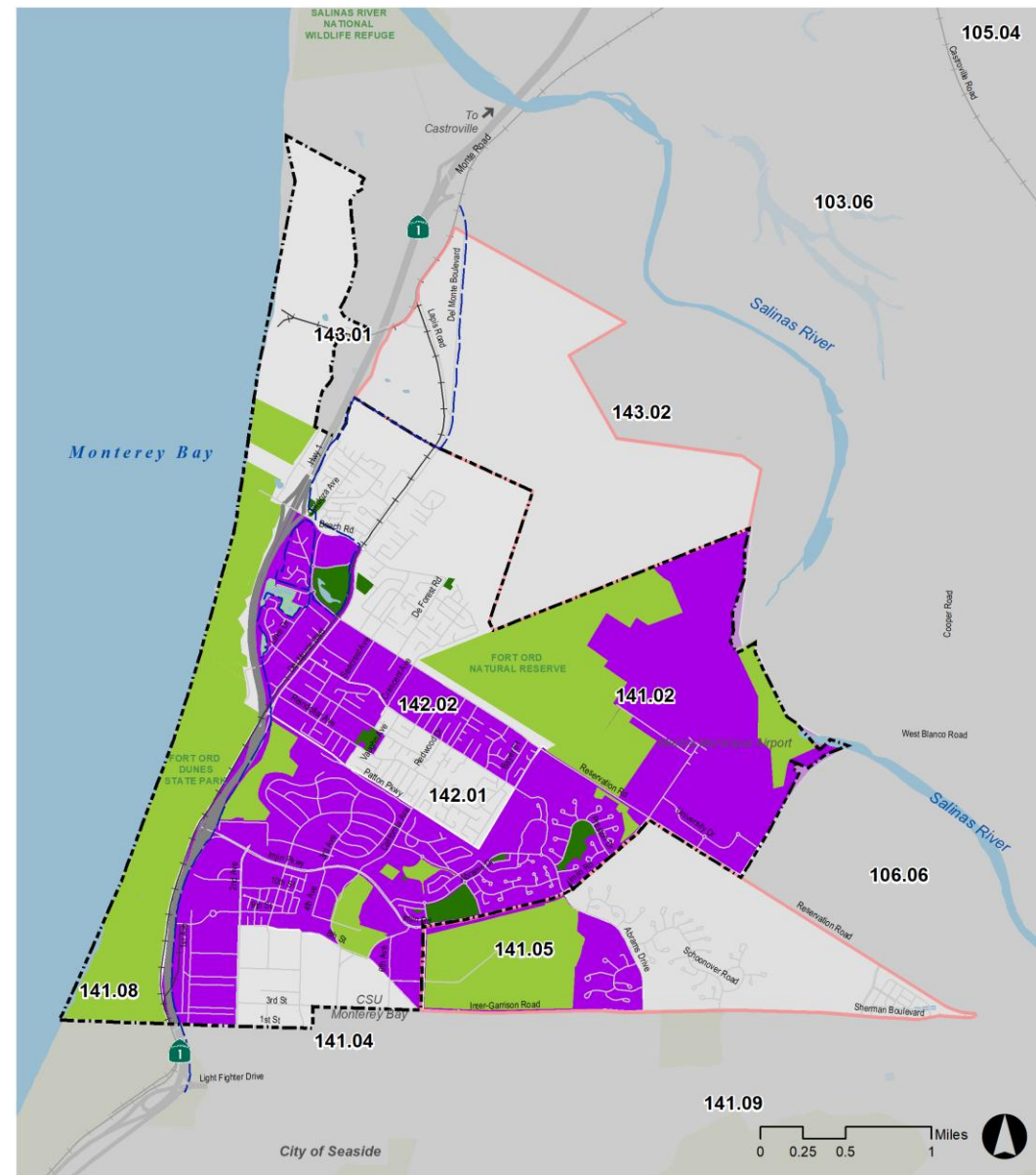
